The PCAC is the coordinating body and funding mechanism for the three riders councils created by the NYS Legislature in 1981: The Long Island Rail Road Commuter's Council; The Metro-North Railroad Commuter Council; and the New York City Transit Riders Council. These councils were created to give users of the MTA services a say in the formulation and implementation of MTA policy and to hold the MTA board and management accountable to riders. Each council selects a non-voting representative to the MTA board. Members are appointed by the Governor's office, upon the recommendation of county executives and, for New York City, the mayor, public advocate, and borough presidents.
